Balloon Care & Safety Information

Thank you for choosing us for your balloon décor! We use the highest quality balloons and take great care in our installations. To ensure your balloons last as long as possible, please follow these care and safety guidelines.

Handling & Transport

Balloons are delicate and should be transported with care. Keep them in a cool, well-ventilated space and avoid sudden movements. If transporting by car, use air-conditioning and avoid placing balloons in direct sunlight or leaving them in a hot vehicle.

Balloons & Sharp Objects

Balloons can easily pop when they come into contact with rough or sharp surfaces like trees, grass, walls, bricks, and car doors. Keep them away from scissors, pins, and other sharp objects. Static electricity from televisions, computers, and rough ceilings may also cause balloons to pop.

Rain & Humidity

The Weather can affect the look and lifespan of balloons. Rain may cause helium balloons to droop, and humidity can weaken latex balloons, making them more prone to popping.

Outdoor Balloons

While balloons can add beauty to outdoor events, they don't last as long outside. Wind, sun, rain, and temperature changes can impact their lifespan. Balloons may get tangled in trees or hit rough surfaces, leading to popping.

Balloon Safety for Children & Pets

Never leave children or pets unattended with balloons. Popped or deflated balloons can be a choking hazard. Keep balloons out of reach to ensure their safety.

Oxidised Balloons

Latex balloons naturally oxidize when exposed to oxygen, heat, and sunlight. This process causes them to lose their shine and develop a cloudy, matte appearance. While some love this soft, velvety look, others prefer the glossy finish of fresh balloons. To slow oxidation, keep your balloons indoors, away from direct sunlight and extreme temperatures.

Environmental Responsibility

Never release balloons into the environment, as they become litter and can harm wildlife. Dispose of balloons properly by popping and placing them in a bin.

Balloon Longevity

Helium Balloons (Without Hi-float) Typically last 8-12 hours.

Helium Balloons (With Hi-float) Typically last 24 - 72 hours.

Balloon Garlands & Installations Can last up to around 2 - 4 weeks indoors.
